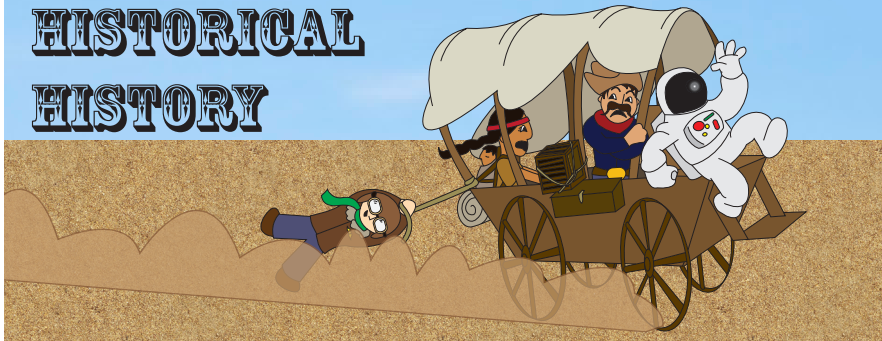

Acting Up Age: 8-12 Mar. 1-Apr. 12
Explore the building blocks of acting and performance. We will focus on individual vocal and physical skills, character building, and scene work!

Act it Out: Little Red Riding Hood Age: 5-8 Mar. 1-Apr. 19
We will work together to interpret a class story combining creative storytelling skills with acting and basic stagecraft!

Director's Note

This production is the realization of many years of various male members of the Limelight ensemble, young and old, approaching me and saying something like, 'We should do 12 Angry Men.' Well, ask and ye shall receive. The feature film version from 1957 is a master class in filmmaking technique. Directed by one of the greats, Sidney Lumet, its tension keeps escalating to nearly unbearable levels, and the performances are all expertly delivered by a rogue's gallery of classic Hollywood character actors. Something about this story transcends era. As an indictment, really, of prejudice in all its forms, it depicts the struggle of individuals to live up to the ideals of the American justice system as an institution. The story is a testament to the importance of thinking, and evaluating evidence, and the danger of rushing to judgment, ideals as universal as the show you see tonight.
